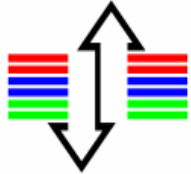


Why You Should Join Forces with CNATCA

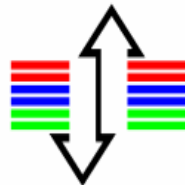

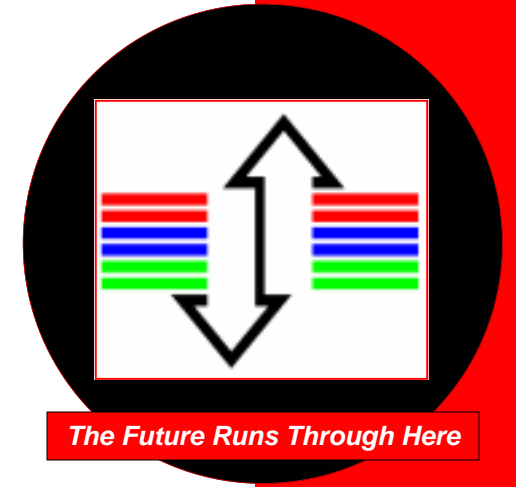

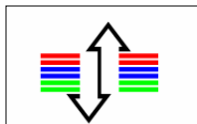
